Catherine Thomsen, 88, of Clinton, passed away Friday, July 15, 2016, at the Harbor Crest Home, Fulton, Illinois. Funeral services will be held at 3:00 PM Tuesday, July 19, 2016 at St. John's Lutheran Church, Clinton. Visitation will be held from 2:00 PM until the service hour Tuesday at the Church. The Clinton Chapel Snell-Zornig Funeral Home is assisting the family with arrangements. Burial will take place at Clinton Lawn Cemetery. Pallbearers will be her grandsons.

Catherine was born February 10, 1928 in Charlotte, Iowa, the daughter of Eduard and Marie (Luff) Andresen. She was an Elvira High School graduate and received her associate's degree from Coe College in Cedar Rapids. 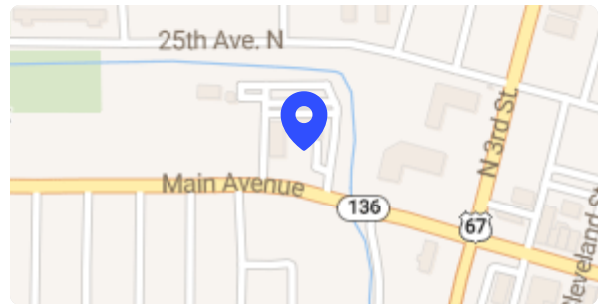

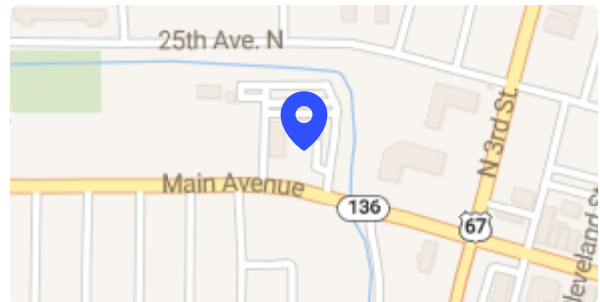

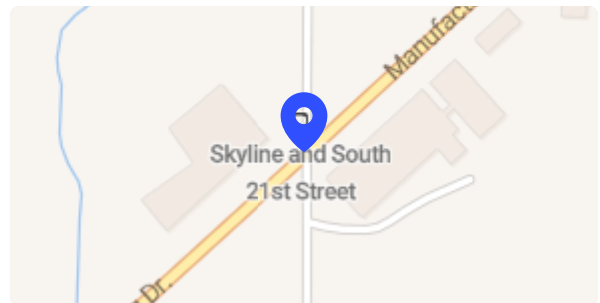
