Donald H. Shaw, 90, of Camanche, passed away, Saturday, September 30, 2017 surrounded by his family at home.

Graveside Services will be 11:00am, Thursday, October 5, 2017 at Clinton Lawn Cemetery. Camanche Chapel Snell-Zornig Funeral Homes & Crematory is assisting the family.

Donald Harry Shaw, Sr., was born on April 25, 1927 in Clinton, the son of Harry M. and Laura B. (Hatfield) Shaw. He served in the United States Navy during World War II. He married Annabell M. Marr on February 7, 1945 in Clinton; they had five children: Don, Jr., Dianna, Jacquelyn, Reva, and Philip.

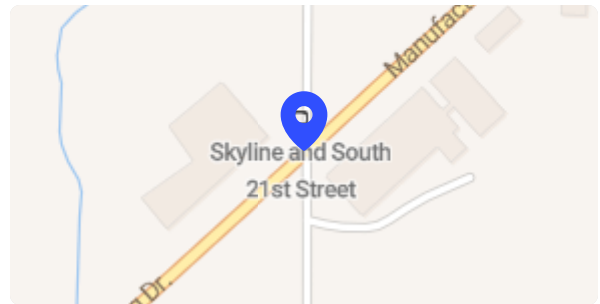

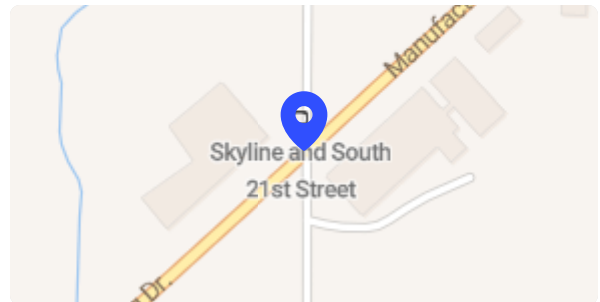
