Jerry Henry, 83, of Clinton, passed away, Friday, May 11, 2018 at his home in Clinton.

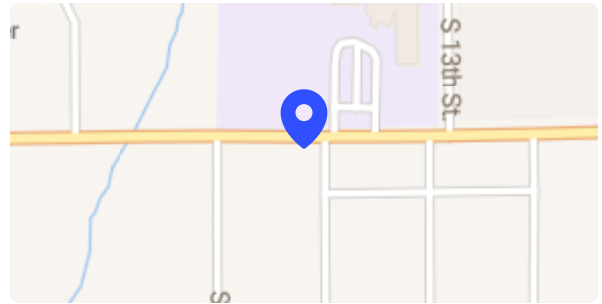
