Myrrtle E. Palmer, 80, of Camanche died Sunday, October 23, 2011 at Mercy North, Clinton. Funeral services will be 10:30am Wednesday, October 26, 2011 at the Camanche Chapel Snell-Zornig Funeral Home & Crematory. Visitation will be from 4 to 7:00pm, Tuesday, October 25, 2011 at the Camanche Chapel Snell-Zornig Funeral Home. Burial will be in Clinton Lawn Cemetery.
