Sheila M. Wildman, 85, of Clinton, died peacefully Saturday, June 20, 2009 at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, Iowa City, Iowa. Mass of the Christian Burial will be 11:00am, Wednesday, June 24, 2009 at Prince of Peace Catholic Church with Father Tony Herold presiding. Visitation will be from 9:00am to the mass time at the church. Following the services the body will be cremated. Private family burial will be in the Clinton Lawn Cemetery. The Clinton Chapel Snell-Zornig Funeral Homes and Crematory is in charge of arrangements. Sheila M. Swamberger was born on June 18, 1924 in Clinton, Iowa the daughter of Edmund and Marian (Yuppie) Swamberger. She married Jerry Wildman on February 4, 1967 in Fremont, Nebraska, he later died January 20, 1999. Sheila was a 1942 graduate of Mt. St. Clare Academy.
