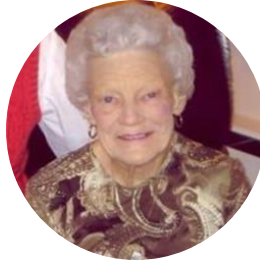

Esther H. Barber, 86, of DeWitt, Iowa, died Friday, January 2, 2009 at West Wing Place, DeWitt, Iowa. A Memorial Service will be held at 10:30am, Tuesday, January 6, 2009 at the First Congregational United Church of Christ in DeWitt with Pastor Jeff Wartgow officiating. 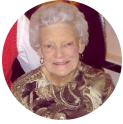
